Prior to the beginning academic session, the routine sub-committee along with the departments frame the routine, which is circulated via Website and notice board d Teaching assignments determining topic allocation is decided in depar meetings by dividing the syllabus into micro modules as per convenie: faculty member's area of interest. These teaching assignments are shar the students in class. After one month of teaching, again departme meetings are held with class representatives discussing the areas require more focus, attendance of students and their overall feedb Corrective measures are discussed, recommended and implemented. Prior month of exam, departmental meetings are held to discuss areas to be c identifying students that require more attention and thereby remedial are taken for both weaker and advanced students. The proceedings ador the departmental meeting are also discussed in the Teachers' Council to get everyone acquainted with the corrective measures where every me

the council had an opportunity to offer innovative ideas for proper d of curriculum. Feedback is taken after the completion of the fin examination. Thereafter, grievances of the students for overall imprc of the academic ambience of the institution are initially tabulated. tabulated feedbacks again are discussed threadbare initially in t departmental meetings for its resolution if it is viable to resolve . they are not then it is forwarded to the Teacher-in-Charge for its not action. Students' assessment of teacher's performance serves as a def institutional mechanism to ensure effective curriculum delivery. Depar seminars are organized at intervals for further enrichment of the cur delivery process. In some of these Seminars, students are encouraged presentations on curricular topics in order to judge their understand also to assess the effectiveness of curriculum delivery by the teacher quality enhancement of the faculty, research initiatives for doctoral doctoral degree are always encouraged. The faculty also participat Refresher courses/Orientation Programmes/ workshops on syllabi organi the University for continuous up gradation of curricular knowledge teaching skills. The College Library is well endowed with text book reference books of various disciplines based on the University stipu curriculum. ICT based teaching is also encouraged for effective deliv the curriculum. Remedial classes are held for slow learners to ens effective communication of the curriculum across students of varying l abilities. Additional study materials and referenced notes are also pa by the faculty to students to ensure effective learning.
